ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

This is not a council meeting but an open public meeting for the whole parish, taking place between now and 1st June. Councillors and representatives of other organisations present reports and take questions. Recent APMs have been held in the Village Hall on Church Street but different arrangements seem inevitable this year. As soon as these are determined, we will post details on the noticeboards and website.

WASTE COLLECTIONS

To allow collection crews to concentrate on emptying blue and black bins during the coming weeks and help to cover any future staff sickness or self isolation, the Greater Cambridge Shared Waste Service has suspended green-bin collections between now and 4th May. Residents are asked to consider postponing any gardening and, as always, to waste as little food as possible. For this period only, the advice is to put any food waste in the black bins.

If your household is displaying symptoms of coronavirus, you should **double-bag any personal waste** (used tissues, disposable cleaning cloths/wipes etc.) and **keep it separate for 72 hours** in a suitable secure place on your property before placing it in the black bin with the rest of your waste. Other household rubbish and recycling should be treated as normal. It is thought the virus will not be viable after 72 hours outside the body and that this approach will help keep the bin collection crews as safe as possible.

A public consultation on proposals for the Cambridgeshire Autonomous Metro (CAM), including potential route alignments for its city tunnel section and location for its city centre station, is open until **3rd April**.

SPEEDING VEHICLES

The Parish Council is aware of people's concern over vehicles speeding within Fen Ditton and is currently waiting for news on its application to have a speeding sensor that could be moved around the village. This would alert drivers to their speeds and have the benefit of providing real data on speeds at different places and times. We have been told that the best results are obtained when these sensors are backed up by a Speedwatch scheme, with groups of trained volunteers logging speeds and recording registration numbers. If you are interested in forming a Speedwatch group within Fen Ditton, please email the Parish Clerk.

- **Pick up after your dog** and use the special bins provided.
